Last month I was to produce a report on a field trip undertaken by a few Native orchid people in October last. With apologies, herewith is the report.... Those who have your newsletter by email now will see additional photo's. On email copies, I do not have to print the colour photo's and therefore, be costly.

### A Field Trip to Bullio

Attending on the day were Alan Stephenson, Denis Wilson, Ken Coates, Daniel Rajaratnam and his daughter, Payton, Peter and Annabelle Andrews, Christine Fawsett, Grahame Bradburn and myself.

The purpose of the field trip was to locate and identify native orchids in the area. *Pterostylis hamata, Hymenochilus bicolour, Dendrobium speciosum* (very large clumps mostly in full flower), *Diuris sulpurea,* lots of *Microtis,* only one with flowers starting to open, probably *unifolia, Cyrtostylis reniformis, Thelymitra,* not yet in flower but probably *ixioidis,* because of spotting on the bud, a great many *Caladenia fuscata* were found on the day, and *Pterostylis curta.* 

A day spent tramping around in the bush looking for native orchids in their natural environment is very satisfying and a great day was had by all.

### A SERIES OF EVENTS Alan Stephenson.

Taking a holiday for three weeks only ensured the catch-up period after would be significant and it has been as it's now three weeks since my return and events are only just threatening to return to normal. The first event was a society day at the home of some very special members, Jan and Elaine Wilton. Their home is under the escarpment at Austinmere and covers more than a half acre. Over the many years they have lived since building their home on what was a sloping and rocky site, they have constructed a rain forest in their back yard. Several tones of rocks have been moved, strategically placed and even used to build a back fence the envy of any stonemason. It is no wonder both are as fit as most people 40 years younger.

They have mounted countless orchids on the many trees they have planted and these include *Dendrobium speciosum, Den. kingianum, Den. ruppianum, Den. gracilicaule, Den. tetragonum,Sarcochilus falcatus, Sarco. olivaceus* and a range of *Dockrillias*. Many species were in flower at the time, making photographs a must. A very large rock which is about the size of a truck bonnet is also home to more than 20 seedling *Sarcochilus*, purchased either through ANOS Illawarra or at the numerous orchid events the couple attend.

An early cup of tea began the day followed by the garden walk and more refreshments and socializing after, left all members more than pleased they made the effort to attend. Hospitality was first class and from my perspective it was good to relax with members away from the formality of a meeting. The next day several members also enjoyed a bush walk to the Nattai Valley site we had visited earlier this year. Seven members presented for the day plus the eldest daughter (Payten) of Daniel our Bulletin editor and we were joined by Wally Southwell of ANOS Macarthur. Despite the lack of rain for the preceding two months we managed to find a few species which were new to most of us. Although the very large plant of Den. speciosum on a rock above the access road (track) was not new to anyone, it presented a challenge just to get to a safe position where it could be photographed. Five minutes later at the home of Ken and Leonie Coates we first inspected their orchid house after the warm welcome followed by a brief walk through the vegetation surrounding the house and then along the road which eventually leads to the Wollondilly River. Expected plants of Diuris sulphurea were found and a Microtis species. Petalochilus fuscatus (photo on cover), Pterostylis curta, Cyrtostylis reniformis and Oligochaetochilus hamatus, which is the species none of us had previously seen and identification was not possible until Denis Wilson perused his book of Orchids of the ACT. Orchids were scarce on this day and while we never saw 3000 of one species (D. truncatum) as per April this year, anytime I find something never seen previously, I consider it a good day. As the location is 1 1/2 hour's drive from the meeting place at Robertson, which is almost an hour from Nowra, the outing did not finish too late, although it was a late dinner for me. This property will hopefully be visited again next year if weather conditions are favourable for the Rufa Group species we hope to find. And finally to the Sarcochilus Show which was as colourful as usual but a little down on plant numbers and also attendance for some reason. This can be attributed to the absence of a couple of members (for legitimate reasons) but also to the obvious decision by some plants to dig in their heels and decide to flower after the show. In some cases, well after the show and the general opinion is the length of winter is responsible for their tardiness. However all areas of the show were covered and for once I am pleased the re-potting bench was not the occasionally frantic area it can be. As members will now be aware the Old Courthouse is now our meeting place as well as show venue and as soon as the courthouse volunteers can arrange the repositioning of an old ammunition storage unit, all of our equipment will be within reach and the loading and unloading of trailers can be a thing of the past.

I thank all members who either exhibited plants, assisted with the judging process, provided food, assisted at a sales table or raffle table and aide with setting-up and dismantling of the show in its entirety. Your assistance is what keeps our group viable.
