### **Benching Review**

Mike Harrison provided an informative review across some of the plants benched at the February meeting. Highlighting the following:

- Dendrobium cucumerinum type specimen comes from Macarthur Mt Hunter / Brownlow Hill. This is it southern most location and occurs north to southern QLD. The plant normally grows on the underside of River Sheoak - casuarina cunninghamiana overhanging water. Dendrobium cucumerinumis often found growing with D. linguiforme and can be quite common. Best host in cultivation is cork and the Secretary should be 'plant' this specimen soon.
- Dendrobium torressae Mike discussed the roots and the way the plant will often grow across itself. This species flowers from the centre of the tiny cane (leaf). It grows on rocks and trees across Nth QLD generally at altitude. Reddish colouring of canes not abnormal but indicates high light locations.
- Dendrodium Red Ballerina 'Macquarie' Cross Red Ballerina originally made by Wally Upton – 75% Dendrobium bigibbum and is (Dendrobium bigibbumx Dendrobium agrostophyllum) x Dendrobium bigibbum.
  Dendrobium Red Ballerina 'Macquarie' is an awarded line breed plant by Macquarie Orchids.
  Very good cold grower often with 12 or so flowers from very long canes.
- Sarcochilus. harticalcar Mike spoke about the restricted range of this plant in the wide from the McIllwraith Ranges (which are now closed to public access). The plant is a progressive flowerer and used extensively in hybridization. Mike brought a seedpod away from his expedition in the McIllwraith Ranges, which was flasked and led to the current cultivation of the species.
- Plectorhizza tridentata a twig epiphyte variable flowering time but very quick grower.Bulbophyllumlageniforme – rarer cultivated plant from Mt Windsor / Mt Lewis, North Queensland – Cloud forest species. Grows on main trunk of tree often with B newportii. Difficult to grow but prefers – hard black treefern to grow on in cultivation
